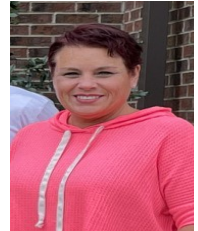

The family services credential is required by Family Services Field Staff who have not currently completed an in-field degree. This credential is completed by the Family Services Team twice a year. The credential is overseen by The Portage Project, which is a contracted agency. The credential provides a minimum of 54 hours towards professional development that focuses on working with and truly engaging families through a strength-based, family-centered approach. The credential allows advocates to increase knowledge on providing quality family services through training on resiliency, ACES (Adverse Childhood Experiences), life loads, creating family goals, leading effective meetings, and teamwork. Each of the participants complete 12 portfolios throughout the credential to demonstrate their understanding of the topics, as well as a project they will implement within their local area. These projects include parent engagement training opportunities, family mapping for writing goals, male involvement in our program, and the importance of routines. One of the greatest parts of the credential is it allows the field staff to form bonds with one another, which in turn builds lasting supportive work relationships.
